A.	Self-esteem of pupils is raised evidenced through personal resilience and higher levels of independent learning.	Pupils are frequently celebrated through behaviour policy reflecting raised learning behaviours and self-esteem. Resilience in learning is demonstrated in lesson observations and through book trawls. Number of playtime/lunchtime disputes is lowered.
B.	Average heights and weight data collated by Staffordshire School Nurses shows a decline in the % of over-weight children in EYFS (2016-2019 combined = 28%)	Data shows declining trend toward the 10% national expectation. Reception Pupils have 1 ½ hours PE teaching each week. Lunchtime provision includes additional PE activities to support healthy lifestyle.
C.	Lack of physical activity due to lockdown	Pupils have 1 ½ hours PE teaching each week. Lunchtime provision includes additional PE activities to support healthy lifestyle. Afterschool club provided 2 times a week
