A.	Self-esteem of pupils is raised evidenced through personal resilience and higher levels of independent learning.	Pupils are frequently celebrated through behaviour policy reflecting raised learning behaviours and self-esteem. Resilience in learning is demonstrated in lesson observations and through book trawls. Number of playtime/lunchtime disputes is lowered.
B.	Pupils in EYFS finding application of skills and knowledge, particularly PD, difficult.	GLD increased above national average (July 2023) Pupil voice shows increased outside learning.
C.	Lack of team work skills in physical activity	Pupils have 1 ½ hours PE teaching each week. Lunchtime provision includes additional PE activities to support healthy lifestyle. Afterschool club provided 2 times a week
D	Lack of progress in swimming due to ongoing COVID 19 restrictions	Swimming lessons in Summer term for Year 3 and 4 to relieve anxiety and build water confidence before moving into upper KS2.
