Dear Parents and Guardians,

I'd like to begin with a big thank you to all our parents and staff who helped to make our remote parent's consultation evening so successful this week. Using new technology is often difficult at first but, overall, the evening ran well. We are so proud of all the children at St. Mary's and can see they are working hard to develop their academic skills. Please do remember that you can speak to your child's class teacher at any time either at the end of the school day, via Class Dojo or by arranging an appointment via the school office.

#### COVID-19

The guidance has once again changed as the pandemic continues to twist and turn. Facemasks are not required within the school building. However, should you wish to wear a face mask please continue to do so.

Please do continue to test as a family regularly using LFD tests. PCR tests are for those who are displaying symptoms, no matter how mild, consisting of; a new continuous cough; a high temperature; a loss or change to taste and/or smell. If your child receives a positive LFD or PCR test they will need to self-isolate. Please contact the school as quickly as possible via telephone or email. The day of receiving the positive test and/or symptoms begin is classed as Day 0. The five day isolation period begins on Day 1, the following day. On Day 5 and 6 your child can take a lateral flow test. If both are negative, and your child has no temperature, they can return to school from Day 6 onwards. Should anyone within your household test positive, we please ask that you keep us informed so we can support you in increased family testing.

# Keeping Safe online



We have recently re-launched our IT Curriculum using Purple Mash which not only develops computing skills but also supports children in developing their knowledge and understanding of staying safe when online. Attached to this week's newsletter you will find a poster from National Safety Online with some reminders of keeping children safe online at home and at school. Should you ever have concerns about your child's online activity please do speak to their class teacher or Mrs Brennan who is safeguarding lead for the school.

## ONLINE CONTENT 10 tips to keep your children safe online

The internet has transformed the ability to access content. Many apps that children use are dependent on user-generated content which can encourage freedom of expression, imagination and creativity. However, due to the sheer volume up loaded every day, it can be difficult for platforms to regulate and moderate everything, which means that disturbing or distressing images, videos or audio clips can slip through the net. That's why we've created this guide to provide parents and carers with some useful tips on keeping children safe online.



#### MONITOR VIEWING HABITS

Whilst most apps have moderation tools, inappropriate content can still slip through the net.



#### CHECK ONLINE CONTENT

Understand what's being shared or what seems to be 'trending' at the moment.



#### CHECK AGE-RATINGS

Make sure they are old enough to use the app and meet the recommended age-limit.



#### CHANGE PRIVACY SETTINGS

Make accounts private and set content filters and parental controls where possible.



#### SPEND TIME ON THE APP

Get used to how apps work, what content is available and what your child likes to watch.



#### LET CHILDREN KNOW YOU'RE THERE



#### ENCOURAGE CRITICAL THINKING

Talk about what people might post online and why some posts could cause distress.



#### LEARN HOW TO REPORT & BLOCK

Always make sure that children know how to use the reporting tools on social media apps.



#### KEEP AN OPEN DIALOGUE

If a child sees distressing material online; isten to their concerns, empathise and offer reassurance.





#### SEEK FURTHER SUPPORT

If a child has been affected by something they've seen online, seek support from your school's safeguarding lead.


