Dear Parents and Guardians,

This week the children have been learning their new routines. This has included where to hang their coats, where to put their book bags and the expectations we have across the school for behaviour. A short explanation is below:



All children start the day on a green card. Green behaviour includes listening to others, trying hard, playing well together and showing our key values of belief, respect and friendship.

Children on a green card at the end of the day are rewarded with Dojo points and/or stickers.



If a child's behaviour does not meet expectations, they will be given two verbal warnings before receiving a yellow card. Parents and guardians will be informed of this via Class Dojo. Sanctions may include 5 minutes' reflection time in class or in another class. (Where possible, we do not send children to classes where a sibling is present.) Sanctions may also include loss of playtime to catch up on missed learning. When behaviour is corrected children return to a green card.



If a red card is given then usually the child is removed from class, either to another class or to a senior leader. Parents and guardians are informed via Dojo and phone call from class teacher or senior leader. An appointment will be arranged with parents and guardians to discuss the child's behaviour if required. Sanctions may include seclusion, extended loss of playtime or learning activities being sent home to be completed due to loss of learning time.

ALL negative behaviour, no matter how big or small, is followed with an opportunity to ask for, give and accept forgiveness. At St. Mary's we know that everybody needs to say 'sorry' at some point. When we say 'sorry' we mean that we regret what we have done, will try not to do it again and hope the person (or people) we have upset will forgive us.

We have fun things to do.

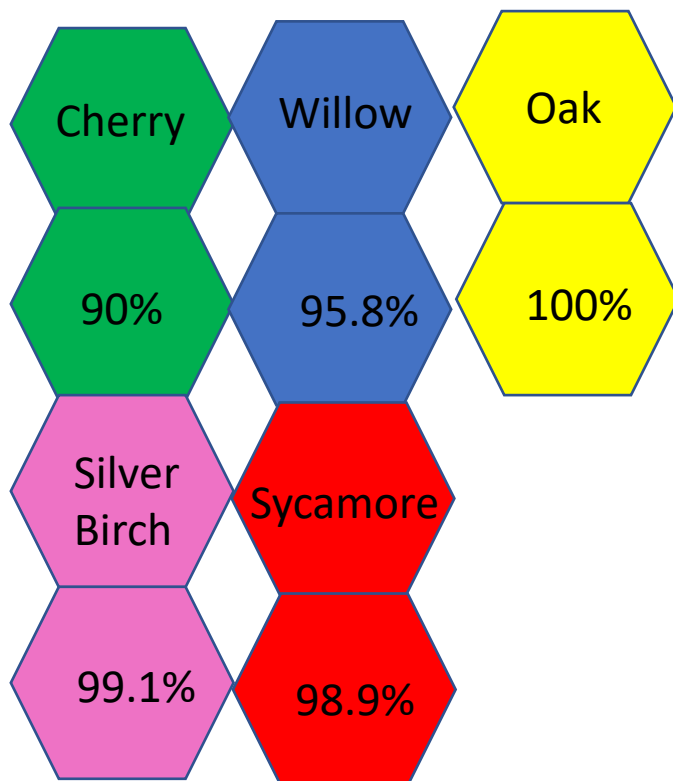
