

- Overseeing the financial performance of our academies and making sure their money is well spent.

- Use and develop your personal and professional skills whatever your circumstances are.
- Gain valuable experience that can be used for other personal and employment opportunities.
- Provides training that is useful in your own life as well as for the role such as e-safety and safeguarding.
- Make a new group of friends and be part of the school community

All Members have the same roles and responsibilities; as a parent LAC Member, you would be a representative member of St Mary's parents, not a parent representative. The role and responsibilities of a LAC Member are set out in further detail in the attached description [see Annex B].

Parent LAC Members are elected to serve for a four year period.

If you would like to stand for election or nominate another parent, please complete the relevant nomination form from the academy office and return it to St Mary's Office by 3:30pm on Monday 4 December 2023. Self-nominations will be accepted, but if you are nominating another parent please seek their prior consent!

Please provide, on your nomination form, a short personal statement (maximum 250 words). The statement should only include biographical information, your reasons for wanting to be a LAC Member and the contribution you believe you can make. If there is only one nominee, s/he will be automatically elected as parent LAC Member. If there is more than one nominee, an election will be held and copies of candidates' personal statements and ballot procedure will be circulated to all parents.

Although children of all ages often watch YouTube content directly via the website or main YouTube app, YouTube itself states that the only place children should be watching its videos is in the YouTube Kids app.



WATCHING TOGETHER

Another good way to keep YouTube viewing positive is to spend time finding channels and content that your child will enjoy and benefit from, in my family, we each get together once a month and show each other our favourite videos from the last four weeks. This not only spanks conversations about what we've wanted but enables us to share the things we've enjoyed watching.



RECOMMENDATIONS

For younger children, you can use the You'lube kids app to keep table on what they have been stacking. Tap on the Recommended icon on the top of the home screen and then suspe right. You will see videos with the play button on them and a red bar at the bottom. These are the videos your child has watched. Anywhere the bar at the bottom is most! black is a video your child has kipped.
